Path to the "Top Four"

- Won at Bamberg in the round of 16, before beating Bayreuth at home in the quarterfinals
- Currently 3rd in the German BBL, 14-6

Team Insights

Munich's offense, which has struggled this season, is perimeter-orientated, slow-paced, and committed to a half-court style of play

- 15th in PPG 82.5, 17th in FGA 62.1
- 7th in 3pt % 36.8 & 6th in OFF Reb 11.9

Defensively, Munich is stronger, allowing just 76.9 PPG On the defensive side, Berlin is also among the best on 60.4 FGA

-> Blk% of 6.5 (of opponents FGA), third in the BBL

Path to the "Top Four"

- Won vs Bonn at home in the round of 16, then away at Göttingen in the quarterfinals
- Currently 1st in the German BBL, 19-1

Team Insights

Berlin, the BBL's top offense, dominates through a team-orientated, fast-paced approach, with consistent ball distribution and player movement

- 1st in PPG 91.1, 1st in AST 24
- 1st in FG% 50.5, 2nd in 3PT% 38.7

teams in the BBL allowing just 79.8 PPG on 66.3 FGA

-> Second lowest DRtg in the BBL, 107.8

The Blueprint

- **Defensive Edge** Munich allows 5.9 fewer shots per game than Berlin
 - Munich's defense must contain Berlin's high-octane offense: limit ball movement and slow the tempo
 - o If Berlin finds a rhythm, it will be tough for Munich to remain competitive, given their offensive struggles
- Win Inside Berlin ranks at the top of the BBL in 2PT%, Munich is 17th
 - Munich will have to find a way to create easy points and be more efficient at the rim
 - If they fail, Alba who also leads the BBL in DREBs will limit Munich to one-and-done's (and that's game)
